Extension of the City Network to Menlo Village by the replacement and enlargement of existing sub-standard watermain network

Objective:- To provide Menlo village with an appropriate and adequate water supply both in terms of meeting the current drinking water needs of existing development in the area and that needed to meet fire-fighting requirements.

Outer City Bypass Distributor Main	€6.85m	2007

Installation of a ring distribution main along the line of the proposed Outer City Bypass, as outlined in the Galway Transportation and Land Use Report, which would enable the Tuam Stage 3 extension (Tuam Interlink) to fully integrate with the City Distribution Network in the North and West suburbs of Galway City.

Objective:- To facilitate the distribution of water to new and developing suburbs within the area of the proposed Outer City Bypass

New Rising Main from Clifton Hill Pumping Station to Tonabrocky Reservoir	€2.50m	2006

The maximum pumping capacity of the existing rising main from Clifton Hill Pumping Station to Tonabrocky Reservoir is not adequate to service the needs of the Western suburbs of Galway City as well as the County Council requirements. A new rising main would, in conjunction with a new reservoir at Tonabrocky which is included in Galway County Council's Assessment of Needs programme, provide the necessary water infrastructure to service these ever-expanding areas.

Objective:- To provide the necessary water infrastructure which would satisfy the requirements of both existing and proposed developments.

Galway Main Drainage Stage 3		

A sum of €25M has been provided in the Water Services Investment programme 2003-2005 for funding the Galway Main Drainage Stage 3 programme. A Brief for the appointment of a Consulting Engineer to undertake a Strategic Drainage Study for Galway City and adjacent areas of County Galway, which is part of the Galway Main Drainage Stage 3 programme, has been forwarded to the D.o.E.H.L.G. for approval.

The principal objective of the Brief is to undertake a Strategic Drainage Study for Galway City and adjacent areas of County Galway. The adjacent areas include Oranmore, Barna, and Claregalway in particular. The Study will include an examination and assessment of existing foul, surface water and storm drainage infrastructure of the determined area and identification



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of future drainage and treatment needs with particular reference to areas being considered for re-zoning as development lands and long term strategic planning for the region.

As required by Circular L11/03, this scheme does not need to be included as part of the present assessment of needs as it is already included as a scheme in the Water Services Investment Programme 2003 – 2005 to commence in 2004.
