

Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to apply for an Affordable Housing Scheme, you must satisfy the following criteria.

- 1. Each applicant must be a First-Time Buyer or meet the exceptions under the Fresh Start Principle or own a home which, because of its size, is not suited to your current accommodation needs.
- 2. Each person included in the application must have the right to reside legally in the country.
- 3. The affordable home must be the household's principle private residence.
- 4. Applicants 'purchasing power must not exceed 95 % of the market value of the property.
- 5. Each Scheme will have different income limits depending on the cost and location of the homes. Please see Affordable Purchase Dwelling Arrangements Income Assessment Policy
- 6. Exception to income limits: The exception caters for a situation where an applicant's income multiplied by 4 exceeds 95 % of the market value of the dwelling, but the applicant is in fact unable to secure a mortgage from a bank/financial institution for 95 % of the market value of the dwelling.
- 7. If you are in a committed relationship, and you intend to live with that person in the affordable dwelling you must submit a 'Joint Application'. Failure to do so may result in your application being disqualified.
- 8. Where applying as a Single Applicant, you must be able to demonstrate that any additional household members included in your application are dependent on you (excluding children of the applicant).
